


## 6 JUDICIAL DISTRICTS

Chicago: 2.71M





# Why Warrants Were Identified as a Strategy

- Warrants were the #1 reason for arrest by the Chicago Police Department (Burns Institute analysis, 2017)
- 62.5% of Cook County warrants were associated with misdemeanor cases (Clerk's Office reports, 2019)
- 72% of warrants were 5 years or older, according to Sheriff's data (*The State of Warrants in Cook County* report, 2017)

in Cook County



# Why Warrants Were Identified as a Strategy Cont.




Warrants were the #1 reason for arrests in: **2017, 2018, 2020, and 2021**

# Types of Arrests in Cook County




Until recently, misdemeanor arrests continued to be the highest type of arrest in Cook County.

In 2021, felony arrests surpassed misdemeanor arrests at 14,620 compared to 14,565.

# The Face of Warrants for Non-Violent Offenses



Latasha Eatman spent almost two months in jail on a warrant issued more than two decades earlier for a probation violation.

**CHICAGO** – More than two decades after a judge waived Latasha Eatman’s court-ordered community service, she was arrested and held in jail without bond for seven weeks, [reports CBS Chicago](#).

Eatman said she was in the store where she’s worked for 15 years on Oct. 14 when two Chicago police officers came in to check if the store was selling illegal cigarettes. The officers issued the store a ticket and ran a check on Eatman’s name. Moments later, she was in handcuffs.

# Strategy Overview

3 Components to the warrant strategy:

- 1. Quash and recall eligible misdemeanor warrants issued in cases that will no longer be pursued by the SAO.**
2. Create opportunities for defendants to learn whether they have an active warrant, and ultimately create mechanisms for defendants to resolve certain types of warrants without fear of immediate detention.
3. Develop policies and practices within stakeholder offices to efficiently manage the influx of new warrants and resolution of old warrants.


A workgroup of representatives from the stakeholder offices oversees the design, implementation and operation of the strategy.

# Eligibility Criteria for Quashing

- Must be misdemeanor
- Issue date of warrant must be 5 years or older
- Case must not involve domestic violence-related charge
- Defendant is not a convicted sex offender
- Victims are notified
- No other cases pending
- No "violent" cases
- No secondary charges for:
  - Weapons
  - DUI
  - Sex offense







Sept. 1982 - June 2016




- Original list: **17K +**
- Over 7,000 cases are missing 'race.'
- Race was not collected prior to 2000.
- D1 and D6 have largest racial disparity, with a 1:2 ratio for White individuals to Black. Largest volume is in D6.



# Community Feedback Cont.

## Preliminary results:

Have you or someone you know had an arrest warrant?

**Yes – 61%**

**No – 29%**

**Unsure – 10%**

How did you or that person find out about the warrant?

**I/They were arrested – 76%**

**Had an attorney find out for me/them – 11%**

**I/They had someone call police/clerk's office – 3%**

**Other – 10%**

Did you or the person you know, try to resolve the warrant?

**Yes – 61%**

**No – 12%**

**I/They did not know how to resolve the warrant – 27%**



# Community Feedback Cont.

## Preliminary results:

If you thought you might have a warrant and wanted to find out, how would you like to go about doing that? Check all that apply

- Through a secure website – 49%**
- In person/walk-in location – 36%**
- A reminder phone call – 36%**
- A reminder email – 32%**
- Zoom or other virtual media platform – 11%**
- Other – 5%**

If you could receive information about a warrant in person, which of these locations feel the most safe and secure? Check all that apply

- Clerk of the Circuit Court via a courthouse location – 42%**
- A community-based organization, like a library – 40%**
- A faith-based organization, like a church – 35%**
- The Law Office of the Cook County Public Defenders – 25%**
- A law enforcement agency – 15%**
- Other – 3%**





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# Cases Quashed & Recalled Since July 1st, 2021 (District 1 - Chicago) AGED 2000-2010



# The Dilemma – Aged in Warrants



The original list of 17K+ warrants contained warrants as early as June 2016 that were eligible.

Since then, more misdemeanor warrants have become eligible.

These 2,794 have become eligible in the last year (July 1, 2021 to September 1, 2022).
